STATE COLLEGE, AAUW Highlights, Causes, and Accomplishments 1926-1955

1926

Clara Phillips was appointed the first woman trustee for PSC, and with her appointment, the school
received its AAUW accreditation. The other two requirements; to have a director of physical education for
women students, and a female on the faculty with full professor status, had already been met.

1927

• Three Branch members were appointed to study the establishment of a town library.

1929

• With the Great Depression underway, the Branch helped provide a community safety net, including child care, protecting senior citizens, and aid to foreigners displaced by international upheaval.

1930

The Branch sponsored a group meeting to listen to the radio broadcast of the White House Conference on Child Health and Protection, which resulted in Branch members' efforts to provide a wide variety of educational resources to area children.

1933

- A movie ticket fund-raiser raised funds for fellowships.
- Branch supported national legislative proposals for a
 - 1) Federal Department of Education,
 - 2) U.S. participation in Permanent Court of International Justice, and
 - 3) adequate appropriations for Women's and Children's Bureaus.

1935

- Branch conducted a joint survey with the PTA to study Kindergarten needs.
- The Branch sent letters to Congressmen supporting passage of the Pure Foods and Drug Act, favoring non-partisan emergency relief, arguing against an appropriation bill cutting the funds for the Bureau of Home Economics, and disapproving a cut in appropriations for the Mother's Assistance Fund.
- Aided State College Welfare Fund.
- Planned musicale fundraisers.

1937

- Economic and Legal Status of Women Group formed.
- Co-sponsored exhibition of Pennsylvania female artists.
- Offered a program on Entrance of Women into Science.

1938

- Sent representatives to Girl Scout Council and Safe Driving Training School Committee.
- Supported request for funds for Centre County Library.
- The International Relations Group addressed the needs of British refugee children.

1939

• Sponsored exhibit at State High of Works Progress Administration art pieces.

1942

- Members bought War Bonds to support the war effort, and a representative was sent to the State College Council of Defense.
- Raised funds for Centre County Bookmobile.
- Created Loan Fund in memory of Lucretia Simmons.

1945

- Supported Equal Rights Amendment.
- Formed Ex-GI Nursery School to help women stay in or return to the work force.

1946

- Appointed representative to Citizen's Committee on Atomic Energy.
- Offered programs on Centre County's Welfare Needs, Fair Employment Practices Commission and Employment for Peace.
- Created Vocational Education Guide.

1947

• Supported Centre County Hospital Building Drive.

1950

• Branch sponsored radio and TV program that led to local public television.

1951

- Lobbied State College Borough Water Authority to add fluorine to the water.
- Established a Graduated Fellowship.

1952

- Distributed study of local government.
- Offered program on Women and Money in a Man's World.

1954

Initiated many fundraisers for Fellowship funds, including the sale of calendars, knives, playing cards.

1955

Status of Women study group sponsored money management programs. Issued handbook for parents of Junior High School children, compiled by education group.
